



100 Day Plan

Pandemic Recovery

My focus will be on vaccinations, safely opening schools, and economic recovery.

- Ensure that funding is available in the district to continue to provide widespread PPE, and accurate testing with rapid turnaround times
- Work with our Board of Supervisors to continue to distribute the vaccine equitably, utilizing community clinics and trusted healthcare officials to educate residents on the effectiveness and importance of the vaccine by delivering community based and culturally competent care
- Make sure that unemployment benefits are available to those who lost employment
- Make rental relief assistance available and accessible
- Work with school districts to ensure the learning loss is being recovered and that the funds and staff are available to provide for the social and emotional needs of all students
- Give childcare providers the funds and support needed to recover
- Work with the small business community, local elected officials and local chambers of commerce to ensure equitable access to state resources as California reboots our economy

State Efforts

- Hire a diverse staff that is experienced and passionate about creating impactful legislation
- Discuss committee assignments with the Speaker of the Assembly, specifically health, budget, elections, education and public safety
- Since the bills for this session would have already been submitted, work on passing legislation that improves inequities in health care, police reform, education and other impacts from the pandemic. Depending on time available in the session, I would request to co-author legislation in these areas, including AB 89, AB 367, AB 32, SB 2 and AB 53.



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Local Efforts

My focus will be on improving visibility and accessibility of the office, staff and resources.

- Hire a diverse staff that is experienced, passionate and familiar with the district and its needs
- Move the district office into the 79th Assembly District
- Create weekly outreach activities that occur in different parts of the district
- Attend all neighborhood association meetings (in person if possible)
- Meet with local elected officials, community groups and faith leaders in the district
- Create workshops to discuss the upcoming budget from the Capitol
- Create a plan to do monthly workshops in the district on issues such as financial literacy, healthcare, boards and commissions, and parent internet safety
- Set up expert-based focus groups on education, healthcare, environmental justice, business, and technology to specifically address and fix the inequities that exist within each.
